- ✓ One complete chapter from a book
- ✓ One article from a journal or magazine
- ✓ A short story or poem not exceeding 10 pages in length from an anthology
- ✓ In the case of a published report of judicial proceedings, the entire report of a single case
- ✓ Or 5% of the publication, if greater than the above

The licence does not cover...

- ✗ Printed Music
- ✗ Newspapers
- ✗ Privately prepared teaching material
- ✗ Published examination papers and published tests
- ✗ Maps, charts, or books of tables
- ✗ 'Copy Permitted' publications
- ✗ Some correspondence courses
- ✗ Workbooks, workcards or assignment sheets
- ✗ Publications which specifically say they are not to be copied under the CLA licence
